PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Accepting the role of president is a huge honour and privilege and one I am proud to hold. I would like to thank the current board members for making the last 12 months so successful. For many of us, we are first- or second-time members, and the learning curve has been significant.

I would like to thank Mitchell Cole for his role as secretary of the HLSC board from 2023 to early 2025. Mitchell was a wonderful support to me in my first eight months as president, providing guidance and advice as I discovered what it meant to be the president of HLSC.

Thank you to Amy Derksen for stepping and taking on the role for the past five months.

My orientation to the role of president has been informed by the many opportunities made available to presidents and the broader lifesaving community by LSV. I was fortunate to be able to attend LSV's

preseason forum, participating in discussions on the updates to the governance framework for LSV as well as changes in how training will be managed and how this may impact the numerous training opportunities that we make available at Hampton.

This information was so important as we planned for another lifesaving season at Hampton.

I attended the annual President's conference and received a whirlwind education on the challenges experienced by lifesaving clubs in Victoria. The key themes were shared across all clubs—volunteer burn out, working with councils, new clubhouses and the difficulties in achieving these. However, what stood out to me so clearly to me was the willingness for presidents to help one another out and share their experiences to ease the path for other clubs.



Our 2024/2025 season was blessed by good weather, which we haven't experienced for a few seasons. Requal was successfully completed, and it was great to see so many familiar faces donning their wetsuits, caps and goggles to brave the chilly water in preparation for another patrol season.

I would like to acknowledge the out-of-patrol-hours interventions by Caroline Webster and Peter Costello who were in the right place at the right time to provide first aid to a Hamberger swimmer and a kite surfer.

Unfortunately, we have seen a 19.7% drop in membership which appears to be due to the drop in Nipper numbers this season. A key element of our 2025/2026 strategic plan is to increase membership numbers and to identify what makes Hampton Life Saving Club a place to join. The pathways we have available for our nippers and young life savers set us apart from our neighbouring clubs.



Once again, our Starfish Nippers program continued to provide a safe and engaging program for our all-ability members, with some longtime members graduating into a new YAHOO group for participants over 18.

Our new Director of Junior Activities Sara McMahon did an extraordinary job of engaging new members and facilitated an excellent Nipper season. While our Nipper numbers were smaller, the quality of the Nipper program was fantastic, and we were able to retain nearly all nippers throughout the season.

I'd like to thank Pete Hetherington for his many years coordinating our fantastic cohort of junior coaches.

Thank you to Chris Auditore for taking over and continuing to grow this exceptional group of life savers.

While we don't currently have a summer competition team, congratulations to Madeleine Marcus, who successfully competed with Anglesea SLSC at the state lifesaving championships, winning gold and taking out the overall championship for a second year.

The winter lifesaving competition has just been completed, and Hampton IRB team was once again very successful, taking both the Open and U23 championships at States.

The team has just returned from competing at the Australian IRB championships in South West Rocks NSW, where our U23 team was crowned Australian champions. In Open competition, Hampton ranked in the top 6, behind Qld and NSW teams. This is an extraordinary effort for a bay club. Congratulations to Mia Osler, Steph York and Josh Laney for winning gold in the Open Women's Rescue.

We were also well represented in the Victorian state team, with nine Hampton members selected to compete against Qld, NSW and SA, resulting in a 3rd place finish.

There is a lot to be proud of at Hampton LSC. Our friendliness, inclusivity and willingness to go the extra mile are appreciated by our community. To ensure we continue to meet the needs of the community when they visit the beach, our ongoing work patrolling and ensuring the safety of those on the beach relies on you and your capacity to volunteer.

FINANCE AND STRATEGY

As we close off another year at HLSC, I'm proud to reflect on the club's continued resilience and adaptability. While 2024/2025 brought some challenges, particularly around membership numbers, the club remains financially stable and well positioned for future growth.

Membership income is down from previous years due to a reduction in overall member numbers, including fewer nippers. This trend is a key area of focus for the board moving forward.

Hall hire continues to be a standout revenue stream. The introduction of our new booking platform, Venuely, has streamlined the process for users and significantly reduced administrative overhead for the club.

Kiosk and bar sales declined this year, correlating with the drop in nipper participation and fewer beach events—notably the cancellation of our IRB carnival due to inclement weather conditions and water quality. A big thanks to Archie Cleland and Zac Laney for their continued assistance in managing the kiosk.

We saw a notable increase in training fees thanks to the successful McKinnon Secondary College Bronze Medallion and SRC program, which attracted strong participation. Thank you to Zoe Murdoch and volunteer water safety officers for delivering this program.

Donations were up, and we're thrilled to continue our partnership with Westfield Southland, who again contributed \$10,000 as our major sponsor.

Overall expenses remained relatively flat year-on-year, with careful management across all areas. This stability has helped us maintain a strong financial footing despite some income fluctuations.

As we enter a new year, the board will be focusing on strategic growth, particularly in rebuilding our membership base. We'll be asking ourselves and our community:

"What makes HLSC different?"

"Why choose us?"

We believe our club's culture, location, and a pathway for juniors after nippers set us apart, and we'll be working hard to communicate that value to prospective members.

A heartfelt thank you once again to our volunteer

bookkeeper, Kathy Pratt, who handed over the reins during the year to Iris Cassell, whose insight and MYOB expertise is proving to be invaluable. And thank you to all our board members and volunteers—your dedication is what keeps HLSC thriving.

This brought through an additional 38 new awards not reflected below.

Thank you to all our members who contributed to the powercraft area at Hampton this season, whether in the boat, training or assisting with maintenance. This dedication means we are able to deliver a high-quality service to the local community—thank you for keeping your skills up to date and our gear in full working order.

In time for the 2025-26 patrol season, we have bought a new IRB hull which will ensure we are able to continue to meet operational needs between the flags and beyond, such as at Nippers, local water safety events and LSV carnivals. This hull has been named in honour of HLSC life member Nick Forbes who, among other contributions, has played a significant part in the training of our IRB Crew and IRB Driver courses.

Over summer, the club also bought two new outboard motors, one of which has already claimed Aussies gold with the Skunks in South West Rocks.

You may have noticed some changes to the storage downstairs. As our club grows but the space remains the same size, it became apparent that our current storage solutions were insufficient and changes needed to be made. With our merch shop moving predominantly online, the space next to the first aid room was renovated to ensure gear could be kept and maintained in a safer, more centralised area.

Finally, a huge thanks to the members who assisted in keeping our gear clean and working, and a special shoutout to Jeff Walton, Paul Laney, Jesse Tammesild and Ben Erwin who have maintained this equipment throughout the year.

The Junior Leaders program at Hampton Life Saving Club continues to thrive and evolve. The 2024–2025 season saw our largest and most diverse coaching team yet, with returning leaders mentoring a new wave of passionate junior coaches. We introduced the requirement for new coaches to attend a minimum of two patrols across the season and will look to extend a minimum patrol requirement to all junior coaches from next season to bolster patrol resources for the future.

Their participation was met with enthusiasm and admiration, further cementing Hampton’s reputation as a leader in junior development.

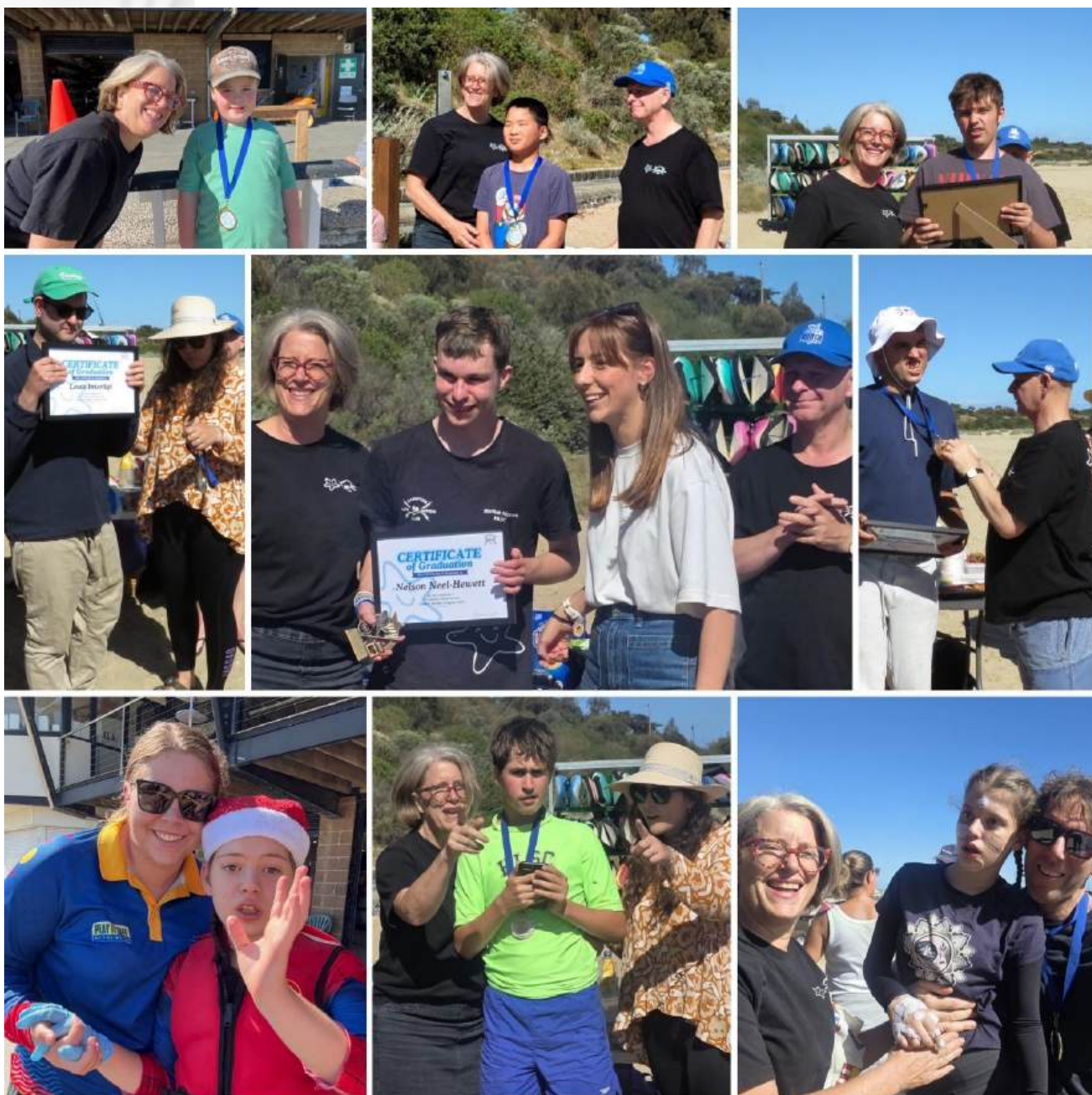

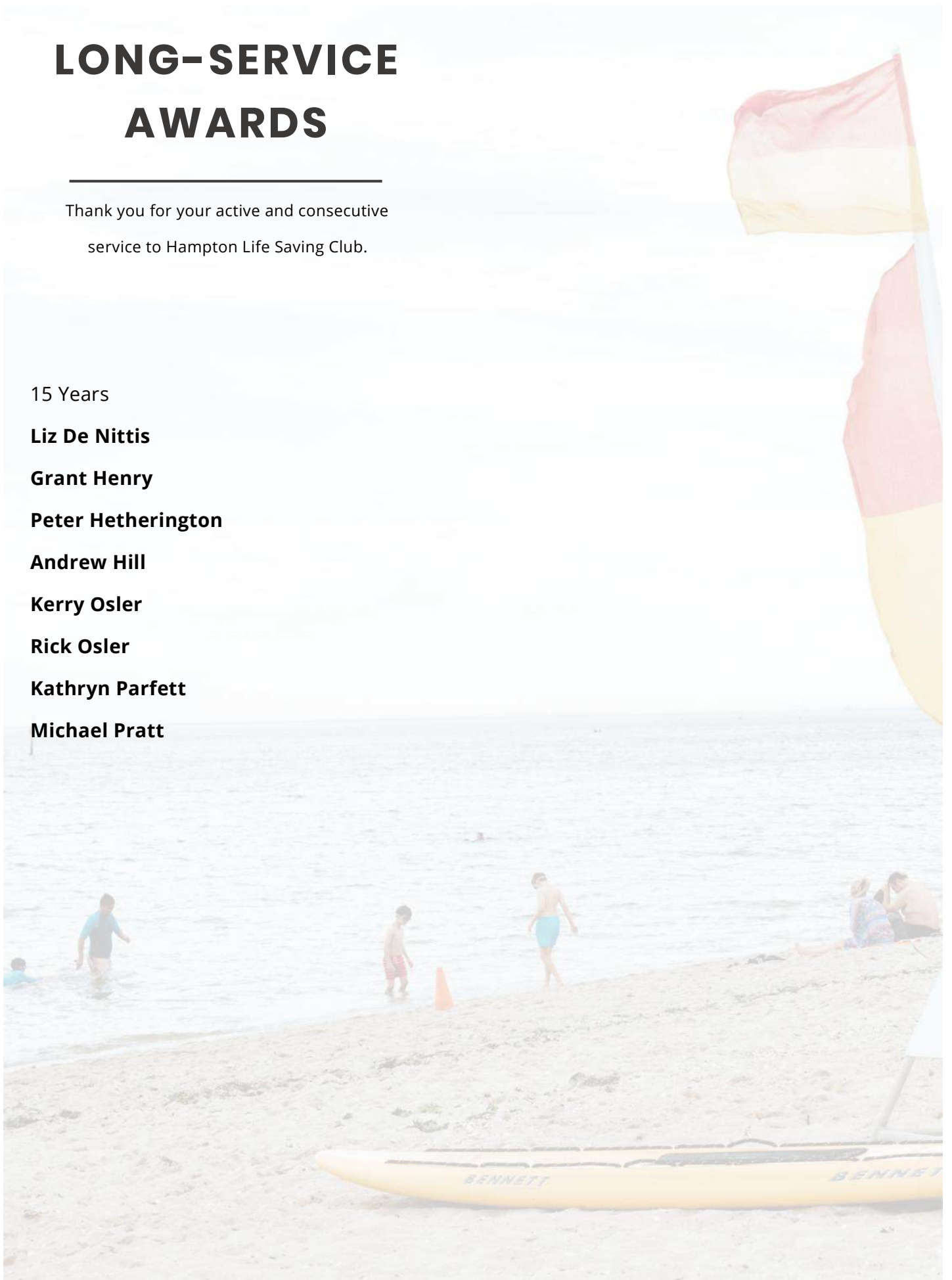
