The 2022–23 season was a great one for the Hampton Life Saving Club, and it has been an honour and privilege to serve on the board of this dynamic club. Membership

Kathryn Parfett, along with Laura-Jay Goudie, have done a mountain of work behind the scenes this season and for several previous years. Hall hire bounced back well with members, friends and the local community taking advantage of the breathtaking views and freshly revamped facilities.

The IRB team have also been super active, chipping in nicely with a great tin rattle result, and earning revenue and exposure for the club by performing multiple water safety shifts at 2XU triathlons.

Expenses were up across the club, reflecting a full slate of activities. Key areas were nipper, patrol and IRB expenses. On the capital expenditure front, we took delivery of a new Bombardier yellow ATV—a very recognisable presence on the beach—as well as a number of rescue and nipper boards.

MEMBER SERVICES


Kirsty Haydon, Director of Member Services

NIPPERS

Sam Dwyer, on behalf of Erin Reed, Director of Junior Activities

What an incredible season for our 217 nippers this year! We are extraordinarily proud of the fabulous young junior activities team who planned, administrated, wrote and ran the program, as well as our 30+ junior coaches who executed it.

Our program goes beyond the standard beach and water skills taught in other programs, extending to the introduction of lifesaving and leadership skills and creating a clear lifesaving pathway—our nippers are mini lifesavers in the making!

This year focused on three major initiatives, the success of which has made us a finalist for the LSV Nipper Program of the Year Award to be decided on 12 August (just after this goes to print):

- 1. **Minimising volunteer burnout:** By getting more people involved and moving to an online project management platform, 15 team members could contribute to behind-the-scenes management and programming, rather than leaving it to one or two people.
- 2. **Parent engagement:** Considerable effort was made to encourage parents to join in as AGMs, parent helpers and BBQ masters. Thank you to the 48 parents who stepped up to become accredited AGMs. It was great to see black-and-white check shirts across the beach, providing crowd management and support to our coaches. Hampton accounted for 25% of all newly accredited AGMs in Victoria this season.
- 3. **Building on lifesaving skills:** We added signals, tube rescue and DRS, to the DRSABC and CPR



events consolidated in previous years. This integration of lifesaving at an early stage of nippers has been identified at state level as a breakthrough initiative, which LSV is keen to replicate across the Victoria and showcase nationally.

Thank you to every nipper parent for volunteering in the kiosk and on the BBQ, assisting with running events, set-up, pack-down, inflatable management and importantly, Sundowners. You truly brought back the community feel after a long struggle back to normal after covid. Also, thank you to our courageous water safety officers who turn up every week and stay in the
