I'm pretty sure everyone enjoyed Nippers—well done Kirsten, Peter and your teams for putting on a great season at very short notice and a big shout-out to our junior coaches for their huge contributions.

We also had the largest-ever Starfish program this season—it's great to see so many people enjoying themselves and challenging themselves on the beach and in the sea. We are very much indebted to Kerrie and her team for this amazing program that continues to expand and succeed.

This year saw the training team take on a new look, as it has been



predominantly made up of young adult members. Annual requal was very different, due to COVID restrictions, and many of us believe it worked better than before! Thanks to our chief instructor, Jas, for organising and running this so smoothly. In addition to requal, our training team ran at least one session of pretty much every major lifesaving award. This is a great effort, and as a trainer/assessor and past chief instructor myself, I know how much time this takes. A big thank you to all of our trainers and assessors for your enthusiasm and commitment—maintaining and enhancing lifesaving skills and life skills in general is a really important part of the club.

What a year for sport! Hampton is fast becoming THE club that dominates on the beach. Thanks so much to Daryn and his team of coaches and parents who run training sessions, organise carnival teams and water safety, act as officials, get everyone there and back, and manage all of the admin. We had outstanding results and we are very proud of everyone's performance at carnivals, states and Aussies.

This year, we finalised renovations to the changing rooms and bathrooms—we were lucky enough to get this done during lockdown when the club was mostly closed. Thank you to everyone involved in making this happen, particularly Carol who managed the team. We also secured grants to replace the roller doors

downstairs and implement a fob-key building access system. Thanks, Helen, for driving these important improvements, as well as all your other contributions to making HLSC membership so enjoyable.

As you can imagine, we have a number of members who perform critical roles behind the scenes. In this regard, I want to mention Kathryn, who worked hard to process our membership applications, renewals and working with children checks. Also, thanks to Amy for coordinating comms. This fabulous team enrolled 839 members, 272 of whom were nippers. So, despite COVID, we welcomed 100 more new members than the previous year!

Fortunately, Craig wasn't too busy this year! Our club chaplain, Colin McInnes Smith, also did outstanding work, greeting people on the beach and supporting Nippers and Starfish on Saturdays.

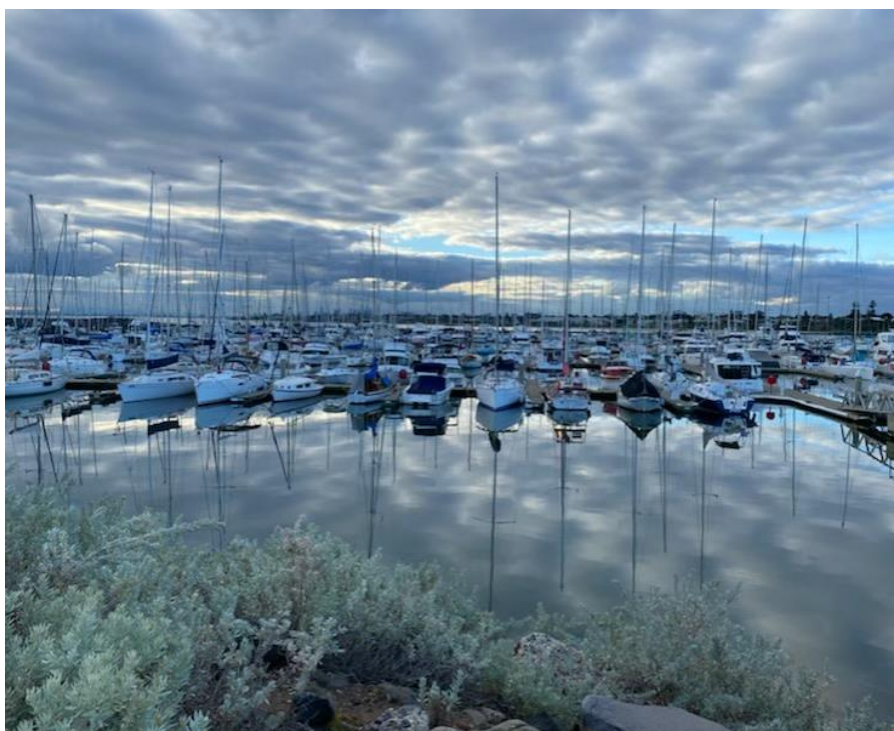
Club Historian

FINANCE AND STRATEGY

It's been an unusual year, with cash in bank \$40,000 lower than the year prior due to COVID and club improvements. Our up- and downstairs bathrooms, and upstairs kitchen, have been renovated. Roller doors were replaced, glass doors were repaired and a new fob security system was installed. An unexpected benefit occurred when Bayside Council accidentally removed our aging (but working) upstairs aircon units, and have committed to replacing them free of charge. Our club is now well placed for a post-COVID recovery!

Grant income was very good last year, with \$97,000 from LSV for renovations, provided we added \$40,000 of our own savings. Starfish Nippers also received a substantial grant of \$20,000 from the Portland House Foundation, which will be spent in the coming season.

Unfortunately, there were significant impacts due to the pandemic. Membership fee and hall hire income were down, due to a shorter season and functions, yoga and fitness training not allowed. Kiosk and bar sales, uniform and merchandise sales, competition fees and sponsorship also suffered. COVID cleaning and other costs added expense.

Other expenses increased, but any new patrol and nippers equipment was purchased prudently, tapping COVID recovery funding and grants by LSV and SLISA.

Even after a severely disrupted season, we have maintained a healthy balance of over \$236,000.

Great news on the strategy front—the board and a team of Bayside strategy experts have launched a club strategic review to set a course for the next three to five years. We expect to complete this by the start of the season and look forward to sharing details. Thank you to the 60+ members who participated in the survey to provide important guidance and feedback.

Thank you, too, to wonderful members who helped with finance and strategy—Steve May, Annette Sando, Chris Sando, Gavin Coote, Sam Krull, Grace and Erin Smith and Laura-Jay Goudie. And to my fellow board members, always kind, supportive and simply the best!

MEMBER SERVICES

In a season much impacted by the pandemic, we still managed to achieve a great deal.

Renovations, Upgrades and Maintenance

In 2020, we received a \$20,500 grant from the State Emergency Services Critical Maintenance and Repair Program. New roller doors were installed in February 2021 to replace our rusted ones before they became unsafe to operate. We also installed an electronic fob access control system to two external and six internal doors, with fobs for patrol captains, sports leaders and others who require access to open and operate the club. Obsolete physical keys will be collected.

In addition, a \$10,000 grant from the Commonwealth's Stronger Communities Program Round 6 will be used to renovate the kiosk and gym flooring this winter.

The club also engaged professional cleaners on a weekly basis to ensure compliance with LSV COVID cleaning standards.

Thanks go to Darren Stone and Paul Harding for keeping on top of maintenance issues, and to Carol Lawrence for helping out in myriad capacities.

Events

Nippers BBQs, the kiosk and Sundowners were run each week—thanks to the volunteers who stepped up to help cook and serve the hungry and thirsty hordes. Santa paid us a visit via IRB, delivering lollies for Christmas Nippers, and thanks go to Jas Lawrence, Jessie Tammesild and Santa (you know who you are)! The Life Members Tea went ahead as planned. And two more members, Susie Massey and Stuart Worn, received their RSA certificates and are ready for bar duties.

Hall Hire

Some hire events were able to take place between lockdowns, but not many. Thank you to Sienna Costello who was our hall hire manager for the season.

In a first for the club, Tom Horton and Fred Shaw put up their hands to organise a Blue Patrol, focused on "Saving Lives on and off the Beach". Tom and Fred looked to raise awareness of mental health for patrollers. Although the weather was quite inclement, a large number of people turned up to hear Peter Bellion talk about dealing with PTSD after his time with Victoria Police and Luke Richards talk about how open water swimming and relying on friends helped lift him out of



dark times. LSV is looking to push this great event further next year.

Through the generous support of SLISA, LSV and the Bayside Council, the club was able to acquire equipment to fully set up a satellite patrol including a defibrillator, oxygen set, etc. at Green Point. Thanks to Samuel Marcus for running this patrol and attracting many of our youth members to participate.

Thank you again to all—here's to another successful season in 2021-22!

NIPPERS

What a year to take over from the previous director—the amazing Pete Hetherington—as the new director of junior activities. This Nipper season was quite unlike any we have seen before, starting with being unable to commence in November due to COVID-19 restrictions on large sporting events.

Still, young people and their families in Hampton, Sandringham, Brighton and beyond didn't let us down as we had 196 registrations for the season, including a large intake of 47 nippers in the U6 group.

So, in the context of social distancing, QR codes and equipment being washed more than it has ever been,



we started the season with the usual excitement, thanks to our impressive group of junior coaches, age group managers (AGMs) and parent helpers. Nipper sessions were sometimes chaotic, as we all worked within a revised programme and without the usual preseason information sessions for new parents and AGMs. However, we still managed to offer a range of beach and water activities to help the nippers develop their lifesaving skills. As with every season, many a friendship was formed and renewed.

We were very fortunate to have a large number of U13s successfully complete their resuscitation certificates and U14s complete their surf rescue certificates (SRCs) in December. This is a great demonstration of how HLSC are developing younger members to take their next steps in lifesaving. Thank you to Jas Lawrence and



her awesome team of trainers, as well as Sam Dwyer, Helen Partridge and Mia Osler, for working with the U13s and U14s to help them achieve these awards.

Junior coaches continued to impress with their maturity and sense of fun in training the nippers and acting as water safety officials. We farewelled some junior coaches and warmly welcomed new ones. Their professionalism was greatly appreciated by the families. I would also like to congratulate our nipper captains, Elizabeth Auditore and Savannah James and our sport captain, Caitlyn Henry.

The very popular Aquaglide equipment came out whenever the weather allowed, and we had a fantastic time on the mats and trampolines. While COVID-19 added complexities to our season, the weather also wasn't on our side, forcing us to cancel sessions due to poor water quality. It is always disappointing to do this, however, our focus is to always ensure the health and well-being of our participants.



We were happy that we could hold club championships for lifesaving skills (U12-U14) and sport after some terrible weather closed the beach. Club Championships in Sport allow all ages to display their skills on sand and water, while the Club Championships for Lifesaving lets senior nippers shine in demonstrating CPR and live patient assessment skills. The overall club champions are determined by combining sport and lifesaving results. It was fantastic to see so many nippers participate and demonstrate all they have learned over the season. There were lots of laughs and smiles throughout the day.

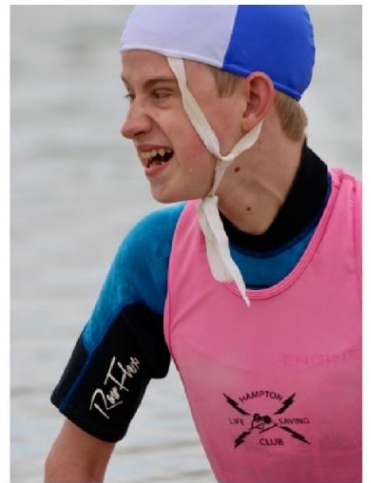
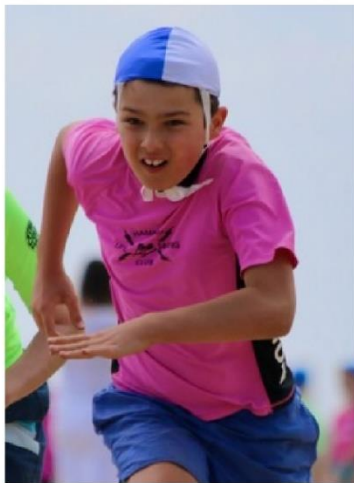

Now in our third season of the Junior Coaching Program, we welcomed back 16 experienced coaches who were joined by 12 junior club members ready to start their coaching training. This large number of junior coaches allowed us to allocate a permanent coach to each Nipper group, as well as having the benefit of several 'specialist' coaches to assist teaching specific nipper and lifesaving skills.

In a first this season, eight of our new coaches were from the U14 nipper group. These new coaches completed the Australian Sports Commission Course online and participated in a practical training session held by Michael Pratt. They will continue their coaching training and, once eligible, will complete the SLSA Surf Coaching accreditation.

As in previous seasons, the junior coaches excelled in their responsibilities on the beach. Each week, the coaches confirmed their availability, reviewed their programs prior to the sessions and arrived early on the beach to attend their briefings. We are so proud of how these experienced, fit role models conduct themselves on the beach.

This season, the Junior Coaching Program was a finalist at the LSV Awards of Excellence in the category 'Outstanding Achievement of the Year.'

Each week, nipper coordinators received positive feedback on the standard of coaching from appreciative nipper parents. The nippers themselves also formed positive relationships with their dedicated

SPORT UPDATE

Daryn Marcus, Director of Sport

Two words sum up the 2020/2021 sports season for me: resilience and determination.

After the untimely ending of the previous season, with the cancellation of Youth/Senior States, Aussies, the Gippsland Lakes Paddle Challenge, the pool lifesaving season and the IRB racing season, we emerged from two rounds of lockdown with a lot of questions.

Would there be a sport season? What form would it take? When would it start? How would training be run in a COVID-compliant manner? Could club equipment be used whilst club rooms were off limits? How would carnivals look? The answers were in the hands of the state government and Life Saving Victoria.

As the second lockdown drew to a close and guidelines around training and competing in groups began to firm up, the traits of resilience and determination really shone through and continued to be on display throughout the season.

Resilience: Once training was permitted, small groups informally came together to train whilst maintaining social distancing on the beach. We saw a willingness to adhere to COVID-compliant guidelines and, in the case of our more junior aquatic sports competitors, we observed a fantastic eagerness to continue to train throughout the season—even though restrictions meant they were ineligible to compete at LSV events or represent HLSC at states.

Determination: The recommencement of carnivals in January brought along a whole new set of challenges, not least of which including officials frantically washing down flags between heats whilst competitors looked on, bemused. Our athletes did themselves proud in embracing the limited season, with reduced events and separate water and beach sessions, and their attitudes brought great success at all levels. From juniors through to youth/senior and masters we thrived, with a special mention for our senior women's beach team who excelled at Aussies this past April.

The enjoyment and success of this season would not have been possible without the continued support and contribution of so many members of our club, whether coaching, officiating, providing water safety, taking on IRB duties, managing entries, or ferrying athletes to and from training and carnivals. Special thanks also to our sponsors, Amalocal, Salta and Nexus Industrial.

Sports and the competition squad exist for the benefit of all members, whether your ambition is to win a medal or to have fun participating in training and carnivals. I strongly encourage everyone to get involved and I can assure you that the competition squad would love to have you on board.

Even given the COVID-driven frustrations and disappointment of the past year, I have thoroughly enjoyed my three years as the Director of Sports for HLSC and I look forward to supporting your new director going forward. Go Hampton!!!

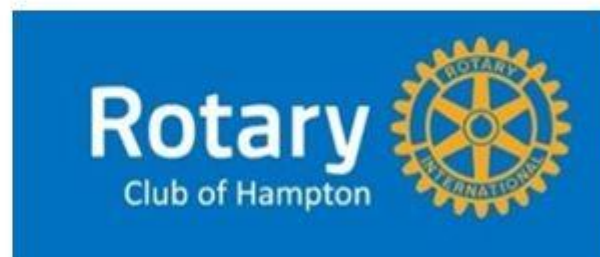
